THE PRESIDENT’S LETTER



Dear Members:

“You can’t please everyone.”

Frankly, I was starting to wonder if we were on track to disprove the veracity of that time honored quote. As we rolled out new phases of our Transformation, the comments have been overwhelmingly and consistently positive. But my faith in human nature and in the variety of tastes that make up any 5,000 member community has been restored. We have started

to receive constructive feedback on the Club and its operations, so I can verify that the aphorism is true. But we really do welcome that feedback.

In truth, as President of the Club for nearly three years, I’ve heard my share of feedback about a number of things. And, with the help of the management team, I’ve learned to take suggestions in stride, implement where possible, and, above all, always acknowledge the member’s right to their opinion. But I will say I’ve also learned the wisdom of another old saying: *“You catch more flies with honey than you do with vinegar.”*

I have to admit that the more sincerity and less hyperbole that a member uses in sharing a suggestion or complaint, the more folks are drawn to consider their suggestions or comments. When someone tosses out a line like this in making his arguments, it does reduce the zeal with which one reacts. *“...are those who created and delivered the institution to the gates of Hell and the jaws of death going to walk away w/o accounting for the gross negligence?”* Doesn’t exactly encourage you to have an open mind about that writer’s ideas...

Fortunately, most people are much more constructive in their suggestions and communications. I recently participated in a meeting with our Nominating Committee that resulted from a productive suggestion made by a member two years ago. The Member was concerned that the Nominating Committee was acting without the benefit of interaction with our Board of Governors. Based upon discussions with this Member, we added a by law requiring the Nominating Committee to meet each fall with the Executive Committee and the General Manager. It has become a great new tradition.

Our meeting this year with Nominating Chair Phil Haughey and his committee covered the major initiatives that the Board is undertaking, committee membership, a review of the “depth chart” showing which terms run out or are up for re-election, a review of the attendance and contribution of each Director, and a discussion with the General Manager about what the Board could be doing better and the challenges ahead of the Club. All this would not have been possible without the reasonable suggestion made by that member two years ago. Criticism that leads to improvement is a real plus, so please keep your comments coming; good or bad.

As we consider our wins and our losses, our good decisions and our bad, I would commend to you one final quote, this one from James Bryant Conant, who served 20 years as Harvard’s President: *“Just like a turtle, we only make progress if we stick our neck out.”*

Thank you for your continued support and encouragement as we work to make our Club stronger.

Dear Harvard Club of Boston Membership:

I recently celebrated my third year anniversary and I thought it an opportune time to reflect. I have always been inspired by Dr. John P. Kotter's *8-Step Process for Leading Change*. There was already a "sense of urgency" when I arrived at the Club in December of 2012. The membership meetings in the winter and spring of 2013 were critical in building a guiding coalition. Our Master Planning Committee worked diligently in forming a strategic vision of what the Club could look and feel like while I focused on bringing the two Clubs together as one and addressing some of our financial challenges. Our member committees were "enlisted" and donated an inordinate amount of time to assist in our change. Difficult personnel decisions were made and numerous barriers were removed. We have empowered our management staff to be more creative, take chances, and we reward those efforts. Over the last two years we have celebrated some short term wins:

- Profitability
- New banking arrangement
- Embarked on a major physical transformation project
- Renovated our fitness facility "in house"
- Opened our new Veritas Lounge & new rear entrance
- Re-aligned and improved our marketing & member communication efforts





Sworn in as Attorney General on January 21, 2015, Maura Healey previously helped lead the Attorney General’s Office over the last seven years as head of the Civil Rights Division and as Chief of the Public Protection and Business & Labor Bureaus. Healey was the architect of the state’s successful challenge to the Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA), which she argued and won twice in federal court before the Supreme Court finally struck it down. As Public Protection Bureau Chief, Healey took on and shut down predatory lenders that were wreaking havoc on Massachusetts communities and oversaw a team that has worked with homeowners to help make their loans affordable – the program has gotten banks to modify thousands of home mortgages and stop more than 900 foreclosures.

Healey helped advise and defend the Massachusetts buffer zone law which protected women from being harassed at reproductive health centers. She will enforce the Massachusetts Safe Access Law and stand against any efforts to limit women’s access to care they need. After a college student told her that Apple’s iTunes wasn’t accessible to him because he was blind, Healey secured an agreement that solved the problem and has made Apple a leader in accessible technology.

To safeguard communities, Healey will partner with federal, state and local law enforcement, using all the civil and criminal tools in the Attorney General’s authority, to address gun violence, domestic violence, and sexual assault.

Healey grew up the oldest of five brothers and sisters. Her mother worked as a school nurse, her father was a captain in the Navy and an engineer, and her stepfather taught history and coached high school sports. Her family roots are in Newburyport and along the North Shore, where her grandfathers worked on the fishing docks of Gloucester, at the post office, and in the General Electric factory. From her family, she learned values of hard work, discipline, and the importance of taking care of others.

Healey graduated from Harvard in 1992 and was captain of the women’s basketball team. She played professional basketball in Europe before returning to Massachusetts to attend Northeastern University Law School. Early in her career, Healey clerked for a federal judge and served as a litigator at the international law firm WilmerHale (formerly Hale & Dorr) and as a Special Assistant District Attorney in Middlesex County. She lives with her partner in Charlestown.
