



Dear Members,

Things continue to be busy at the Club, and I hope you have had a chance to sample the new menu items at both Clubhouses. We receive very positive feedback about the improvements that have

been made, including many comments about the enhanced member experience and service. Special thanks to our Club management and our dedicated staff!

There are several upcoming events that are worth noting, including the Global Travel and Dining program featuring Southeast Asia, the Four-Handed Illusions performance that is a very entertaining adult night out, and the Italian Wine Dinner at the Downtown Clubhouse. The Thanksgiving Buffet is always a sellout, so make your reservations right away.

Last month, at the Harvard Prize Book Breakfast, we honored 314 outstanding high school students along with many teachers and family. In addition, we had the opportunity to recognize Joe Donovan, longtime committee member and Board member for his incredible 25+ years of dedication towards this very worthy cause! Many thanks to our hardworking Prize Book Committee, and thanks to our many members who donate to the Harvard Club Foundation.

You may have heard me mention an initiative, Harvard Club with a Heart, since I became President. I am looking to formalize and increase our charitable efforts in the next few years at the Harvard Club. I have asked Board member Kay Foley '10, to spearhead this effort. Many charitable efforts have already been going on, such as frequent donations of food, donations of clothing to Cradles to Crayons, employee participation in the Making Strides Cancer Walk, and through Ellie's

Hats we are donating hats to children battling cancer. A few new initiatives are already in the works. We have instituted a new functions policy to attract nonprofit charities to host their events and committee meetings at the Club. On June 24, 2016, the chefs of the Harvard Club worked the grills at the annual Chefs in Shorts, at the Seaport World Trade Center. The event benefits a local group called Future Chefs of Boston that prepares urban youth for their careers in culinary arts. On January 26th, we will be hosting an art auction at the Club to benefit ArtLifting and the many artists it supports living with homelessness or disabilities (artlifting.com).





FACULTY LECTURE SERIES WITH BRUCE SCHULMAN





MEMBER SPOTLIGHT: CALAIS BIERY

A year ago, The Harvard Club welcomed Calais Biery and her husband, David, as new members. The couple has been featured in member event photographs, including the 2016 Member Appreciation Gala, which received publicity in numerous media outlets. What fellow members wouldn't know based on her appearance – she suffered burns over 48% of her body in a high school chemistry accident. She endured years of physical therapy and reconstructive surgeries following the accident. The classroom experiment, which involved methanol-based flame testing, was preventable. Precautions were not taken to keep the students safe.

Calais has worked to raise classroom lab safety awareness nationally and as a result, a 2015 safety alert was issued by the National Science Teachers Association recommending teachers immediately halt methanol-based flame tests. The alert also provided alternative chemicals for lab demonstrations.

In addition to her advocacy work, Calais has supported burn victims of classroom accidents seeking resources related to reconstructive surgery



and health issues. She was featured in *Trial by Fire*, a nonprofit documentary produced to help survivors heal, raise burn awareness and promote fire prevention.

Calais graduated from Wellesley in 2011 and is currently a student in an accelerated nursing program at Northeastern University. This past July, Calais and David celebrated their first wedding anniversary.
