



THE PRESIDENT'S LETTER



Dear Members:

The holiday season is in full swing and we are celebrating at the Harvard Club of Boston! Mark your calendars for some fun seasonal events like Gingerbread House Making on December 8, Children's

Lunch with Santa on December 10 and 11, Cookies for Kids Cancer Charity Event on December 10, and the Copley Singers and Champagne Reception on December 12. We also have tickets to the classic Nutcracker for December 16, a Boston Ballet production not to be missed this time of year.

I'm pleased to announce that the Harvard Club has once again been named a Platinum Club of America®, an honor awarded to only 5% of private clubs in North America. We were ranked 24th two years ago and have now risen to 16th. The award recognizes our reputation, quality of service, governance, and innovation.

I'd also like to recognize our culinary team at the Harvard Club. Last month, we hosted a private dinner for the *Forbes Magazine* 30 Under 30 team, which was attended by a number of prominent Bostonians, including some influential city leaders. The feedback on the dinner was fantastic – the group raved about the meal, saying that the Harvard Club used to be the place for pot roast and meatloaf and now in the last 24 months, it has changed into one of the go-to spots in Boston for great service and food. If you haven't dined at the Club recently, it's time to try our new menus and see how much dining at the Club has changed.

As you know from an earlier President's Letter, Board Vice President Matt Hegarty has been working on a proposal to make it easier for more members to serve on Club committees, and to make the process of becoming involved more transparent. Our volunteers are the life blood of the

Harvard Club, and very little could be accomplished without their generous donation of time and energy. The Club has four operating committees (Member Engagement, Membership & Marketing, House, and Budget) and 14 subcommittees, with opportunities for about 150 members to become involved. I have served on nearly every committee at the Harvard Club during my tenure here, and I have found it a great way to meet other members and form lasting friendships.

As an Ambassador, you'll be matched with a new member of the Club and serve as their mentor for the first few months, helping them become integrated into Club life. 





STAFF PROFILE: PATRICK LAXTON


