Dear Harvard Club of Boston Membership:

As the Club has reached the halfway point of the fiscal year I thought this was an opportune time to report that from a fiscal standpoint, we are on pace to achieve our financial goals for the year. Barring a significant unforeseen situation, I am confident the Club will have a profitable fiscal year 2017.

From a capital spending standpoint, the Club has budgeted projects totaling \$800,000 for the year. To date, we have installed a new "grease trap" and "ejector pump" and have replaced one of our steam boilers. We are currently placing an order for significant replacement of carpeting at the Downtown Club and are scheduled for a July installation time.

Additional projects this spring and summer will include a new "rooms chiller" that will bring us stability in the cooling season in our 25 overnight guest rooms. We were informed by the City of Boston Inspectional Services that notwithstanding the fact that we have had hundreds of inspections over the years, we now must install a new ceiling in our main kitchen. This project involves re-engineering and re-installation of our sprinkler system. We will also have to lay out a new lighting plan and purchase new lighting fixtures. With a lower ceiling we will need to address conditioning and circulation of airflow in the kitchen. While this is an unforeseen project, we are working diligently to complete the project sometime this summer when operations slow down. Much of the work will take place from 11 pm to 7 am. This six figure surprise will likely lead to a reshuffling of another capital project we had planned this year and move that project to next fiscal year.

Please join us for our 109th Annual Meeting and Dinner. We are honored this year to be joined by Maura Healey.

Healey is an advocate for a more equal and inclusive workplace. In May 2015, she announced that her office would provide six weeks of paid family leave for all employees – making the AG’s Office the first state agency to offer paid parental leave. The office has also helped shaped state legislation that would expand opportunities for women in the workplace including Pay Equity and Pregnant Workers Fairness bills.

As a civil rights attorney, Healey is committed to ensuring that all residents are treated fairly. As former head of the office’s Civil Rights Division, Healey was the architect of the state’s successful challenge to the Federal Defense of Marriage Act and argued the case in Federal court. As Attorney General, she has advocated for marriage equality and in support of bills to fight discrimination against transgender people. Healey also helped defend the Massachusetts buffer zone law, which protected women from being harassed at reproductive health care centers.

Healey graduated from Harvard College in 1992 and attended Northeastern University School of Law. She was inducted into the New England Basketball Hall of Fame in 2006.
