## PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Dear Members,

It has truly been my privilege to serve as your Club President for the past three years. As this is my last President's Letter to you, I want to acknowledge the hard work and collaborative spirit of the Board of Governors, Committee Chairs and Committees and several Task Force groups, all of whom have worked to position the Club for future success.



As I reflect back on the past three years, I think I am most proud of how revitalized the Club has become, both in terms of the improvements to the facilities, but also the renewed enthusiasm of the members. Many people have mentioned to me how much better the member events have become, that the quality of the dining experience in the restaurants is excellent and that the Club itself has never looked better.

Membership has begun to stabilize, with a substantial decrease in attrition of about 30%. Many members have commented on the increasing diversity of our members and the resulting "buzz" at member events. To introduce the Club to our newest alumni, we started offering a complimentary one year membership to graduates of Harvard College in 2017 and 2018, and the Board again voted to extend this offer to the Class of 2019. I for one think it is wonderful to have these newly minted graduates at events and around the Club.

April brings some special events to the calendar. I hope you will all join me at the 111<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting on April 3. We will conduct important Club business and celebrate the successes of the past year at dinner with special guest Martha Minow of Harvard Law School. After a very positive response last year, we will once again host a Passover Seder on April 19, at which members of all faiths are welcome. We will have a traditional Easter Brunch on April 21.

On a final note, a heartfelt thank you to Steve Cummings. I am grateful for his partnership, leadership and passion for the Harvard Club of Boston. We are very fortunate to benefit from the dedication and hard work of Steve and all the Club management and staff and their daily contributions!

I look forward to enjoying your company at the Club in a less formal capacity.

## GENERAL MANAGER'S LETTER

Dear Members,

I am pleased to report that the Club's financial position is strong and we have just passed the halfway mark in FY 2019. Through six months our net profit is \$500,000+ ahead of plan. The Budget Committee recently approved a revised year end expectation based on strong food, beverage, parking, guest room and dues revenues. Costs have been held in check and a significant percent of increased revenue is falling to the bottom line. Due to these positive results, we have recently increased our deferred maintenance projects for the balance of this year. While the list is substantial, we will continue to do as much as we can in an effort to bring our members the best experience possible.



Planning for FY 2020 is under way and capital expenditures will include continuing our guest room renovations plans, HVAC improvements, building pointing, and roofing projects, just to name a few.

The Annual Meeting is a celebration of our community at the Harvard Club. Join us to hear about our accomplishments during the last fiscal year, get updated on the performance of the Club, ongoing programs and learn about future initiatives. 

## MARK TWAIN HOUSE LECTURE WITH EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR PIETER ROOS

The Mark Twain House and Museum in Hartford, Connecticut, was the home of Samuel Clemens, better known as Mark Twain, and his family from 1874 to 1891. It was designed by Edward Tuckerman Potter and built in the American Gothic style. Clemens biographer Justin Kaplan has called it "part steamboat, part medieval fortress and part cuckoo clock." Clemens and his family enjoyed what the author would later call the happiest and most productive years of his life in their Hartford home.

Clemens wrote many of his best-known works while living there, including *The Adventures of Tom Sawyer*, *The Prince and the Pauper*, *Life on the Mississippi*, *Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*, *A Tramp Abroad* and *A Connecticut Yankee in King Arthur's Court*.

Join us to hear Pieter Roos, Executive Director of the Mark Twain House and Museum, tell us about how this building was declared a National Historic Landmark in



1962, which includes both the historic house and The Mark Twain Museum Center. The facility was the first museum in the nation to attain LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certification from the U.S. Green Building Council.



Angela is the Goldblith Career Development Professor in Applied Biology in the Department of Biological Engineering at MIT and an intramural member of the David H. Koch Institute for Integrative Cancer Research at MIT. She is also an Institute Member of the Broad Institute and a Founding Member of the MIT Center for Precision Cancer Medicine. Her research group aims to discover and develop functional small-molecule probes of transcriptional regulators, including chromatin modifying enzymes and oncogenic transcription factors. Validated probes may be used to advance the understanding of transcription in development and disease. Selected probes may be developed into imaging agents, diagnostic tools, or therapeutic leads.



An acclaimed journalist, Sam Quinones weaves together two classic tales of capitalism run amok whose unintentional collision has been catastrophic. The unfettered prescribing of pain medications during the

1990s reached its peak in Purdue Pharma's campaign to market OxyContin, its new extremely addictive —miracle painkiller. Meanwhile, an influx of black tar heroin — cheap, potent, and originating from one small county on Mexico's west coast, independent of any drug cartel — assaulted small town and mid-cities across the country, driven by a brilliant, almost unbeatable marketing and distribution system. Together these phenomena continue to lay waste to communities from Tennessee to Oregon, Indiana to Mexico.

*Dreamland* is a revelatory account of the corrosive threat facing America and its hearland.







Leo Damrosch spent his boyhood in the mountains of the Philippines where his parents were Episcopalian missionaries. When the war arrived, the family was interned with 1,500 other foreigners in the Los Baños prison camp in Luzon. In 1945, they were liberated by a dramatic airborne operation. After the family's return to the U.S. in 1950, they lived in various towns in Maine.

Educated at Yale, Trinity College, Cambridge and Princeton, Damrosch currently teaches at Harvard where he is Ernest Bernbaum Professor Emeritus of Literature, continuing to teach in the Extension School and Summer School. Damrosch has written several books including *Restless Genius*, a finalist for the National Book Award in nonfiction and winner of the PEN New England.


