GENERAL MANAGER'S LETTER

Dear Members,

This time of year, I like to reflect on our accomplishments at the Club. In addition to continued revenue growth, increased member event attendance, being named a Platinum Club of the World, and very positive feedback on our 2018 Service Satisfaction Survey, I'm extremely proud of the opportunities our staff took this year to give back to our community. As part of our Harvard Club with a Heart initiative, our staff accomplished the following:

- \$20,000 was raised by the Athletic Department for the Cookies for Kids' Cancer, an organization that funds research projects for pediatric cancer.
- \$455 was raised for The Last Hope K9 Rescue, a volunteer run rescue dedicated to saving dogs from high-kill shelters.
- \$225 was raised for St Jude Children's Hospital.
- \$500 was donated to the family of the Weymouth Police Officer Michael Chesna who was killed in the line of duty.
- \$1,000 was raised at the Annual Making Strides Breast Cancer Walk.
- Staff volunteered at Cradles to Crayons preparing holiday care packages for families in need as well as donating new hats, gloves, and scarves.
- Staff participated in a Thanksgiving holiday food drive for families in need hosted by the United Way.
- Our chefs participated in the annual Chefs in Shorts with proceeds going to Boston area youths preparing for a career in the culinary arts.
- Our chefs also participated in the Rodman Ride for Kids event that raises over 1 million dollars annually for Boston area youth at risk.
- Staff participated in the annual "adopt a family for Christmas" program through The Home for Little Wanderers and collected items for a family in need, which are delivered to them anonymously for Christmas.
- We hosted a Dress for Success accessories drive collecting scarves and jewelry for women entering the professional workplace.

And I'd like to give a special thank you to members who donated to our 2018 Annual Holiday Employee Appreciation Fund. The fund is used to celebrate the holidays and promote a sense of pride and team work among the Club's regular staff.

I wish all of you and your families a joyous holiday season. We appreciate your loyalty to the Club and look forward to seeing you in 2019.


A powerful true story about the potential for mercy to redeem us, and a clarion call to fix our broken system of justice—from one of the most brilliant and influential lawyers of our time.

Bryan Stevenson was a young lawyer when he founded the Equal Justice Initiative, a legal practice dedicated to defending those most desperate and in need: the poor, the wrongly condemned, and women and children trapped in the farthest reaches of our criminal justice

system. One of his first cases was that of Walter McMillian, a young man who was sentenced to die for a notorious murder he insisted he didn't commit. The case drew Bryan into a tangle of conspiracy, political machination, and legal brinkmanship—and transformed his understanding of mercy and justice forever.

Transforming the Marketplace toward Healthier Indoor Environments for Everyone

A strong and growing body of research from Harvard University faculty and other scientists has shown that some of the most effective interventions for enhancing the health, productivity and well-being of people in the built environment are through healthier building products. Many of the products used in buildings contain chemicals that are harmful to human health and with a regulatory approach that has been incomplete and unsuccessful, it is up to organizations and consumers to shift the market toward healthier products.

Joe Allen, Assistant Professor of Exposure Assessment Science, will describe the pervasiveness of bioaccumulative and environmentally persistent chemicals throughout traditional buildings, and the interconnection that buildings have with health. Heather Henriksen, Managing Director of the Office for Sustainability will then detail how Harvard is translating this faculty research into



practice through the Healthier Building Materials Academy (HBMA), a partnership between the Harvard Office for Sustainability (OFS) and public health, medical and engineering faculty, including Dr. Allen.

HATE: Why We Should Resist It with Free Speech, Not Censorship is Nadine Strossen's latest work. Nadine Strossen, '72 is the John Marshall Harlan II Professor of Constitutional Law at New York Law School. She was the first woman to become president of the American Civil Liberties Union and has been called one of the most influential business leaders, women or lawyers in *National Law Journal* and *Vanity Fair*.



Immigration and Russian foreign policy are focal points of contemporary US politics, yet little in-depth information about either is available. This panel will address both through the lens of the unrecognized impact of the waves of Russian-speaking immigrants to the US described in *Hammer and Silicon*. We will delve into the unintended consequences of past Soviet and Russian foreign policy that allowed for the immigration of many highly educated, talented Russian-speaking scientists, researchers and entrepreneurs to the US. *Hammer and Silicon* presents the untold story of the significant contributions of these technical professionals to the US innovation economy, particularly in the sectors of software, social media, biotechnology and medicine.

Drawing upon more than 150 in-depth interviews split between Boston/Cambridge and Silicon Valley, the book chronicles the hardships they endured in transit and in cultural adaptation; while also exploring how they took advantage of new opportunities in their adopted homeland. Their stories and experience are part of a broader picture of immigrant contributions to the US tech sector that is relevant to today's debate over the future of immigration policy.
