

## CONVERSATION DINNER WITH HAROLD J. BURSZTAJN, MD

Harold J. Bursztajn, M.D., a graduate of Princeton University and Harvard Medical School (HMS), an Associate Professor of Psychiatry, Founder of the Program in Psychiatry and the Law, and Principal Mentor for students at HMS, as well as a 40-year member of the Boston Psychoanalytic Institute.

The son of Holocaust survivors, Dr. Bursztajn talks about the moral lessons derived from his parents' resilience and courage in the Lodz ghetto in Poland. Synthesizing this personal history with his professional experience he became a founding director and president of the American Bioethics and Culture Institute (ABCI) of the American Unit of the UNESCO Bioethics Chair. Dr. Bursztajn and his colleagues have initiated the Resilience Empowerment Art Project (REAP) to explore how art can fuel morale and empower moral resilience in the face of both ordinary loss and catastrophic trauma.



If you love to read and enjoy stimulating conversation with friends about good books, please join our Book Club. This month we will be reading *Pachinko*, by Min Jin Lee, is a *New York Times* Top Ten Book of the Year 2017 and National Book Award finalist.

In the early 1900s, teenaged Sunja, the adored daughter of a crippled fisherman, falls for a wealthy stranger at the seashore near her home in Korea. He promises her the world, but when she discovers she is pregnant—and that her lover is married—she refuses to be bought. Instead, she accepts an offer of marriage from a gentle, sickly minister passing through on his way to Japan. But her decision to abandon her home, and to reject her son’s powerful father, sets off a dramatic saga that will echo down through the generations.

Richly told and profoundly moving, *Pachinko* is a story of love, sacrifice, ambition, and loyalty. From bustling street


markets to the halls of Japan’s finest universities to the pachinko parlors of the criminal underworld, Lee’s complex and passionate characters—strong, stubborn women, devoted sisters and sons, fathers shaken by moral crisis—survive and thrive against the indifferent arc of history.

As a first-generation college graduate, he knows the power of education to change lives. Nelson received his Ph.D. in Theology from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, and a Master of Music and Bachelor of Music from Hardin-Simmons University.


