
If you love to read and enjoy stimulating conversation with friends about good books, please join our Book Club. This month we will be reading *The Wright Brothers*, by David McCullough. A brief description is listed below.

On a winter day in 1903, in the Outer Banks of North Carolina, two brothers changed history. But it would take the world some time to believe that the age of flight had begun, with the first powered machine carrying a pilot.

Orville and Wilbur Wright were men of exceptional courage and determination, and of far-ranging intellectual interests and ceaseless curiosity. When they worked together, no problem seemed to be insurmountable. Wilbur was unquestionably a genius. Orville had such mechanical ingenuity as few had ever seen. That they had no more than a public high school

education and little money never stopped them in their mission to take to the air.

Master historian David McCullough "shows as never before how two Ohio boys from a remarkable family taught the world to fly" (*The Washington Post*.) He draws on the extensive Wright family papers to profile not only the brothers, but their sister, Katharine, without whom things might well have gone differently for them.

## CHEF'S CORNER



Dear Members,

We are always looking for new items to introduce to our menus here at the Club. Recently we had the pleasure of partnering with a small family-owned Greek olive farm and placed an order for the yearly olive oil pressing. Elaiolado manis olive oil is from the village of Selegoudion and is part of the complex of Mesa Mani villages in Greece. The family keeps the 220 year old tradition on cultivating olive trees and harvests their fruits to make the most precious Greek olive oil. The farm consists of 200 Koroneiki and Manaki olive trees and the fruit is collected annually and the oil is extracted in traditional olive mills. We were fortunate to be able to purchase a barrel for the Club and will continue to do so each year. We'll use the extra virgin olive oil in dishes in Veritas and ClubPub. The oil is used as a finishing oil rather than a cooking oil to preserve the unique flavors of the fruit.

With the new spring menu coming, it's a great time to have dinner in Veritas' Back Bay Wine Room. The new menu has wonderful options to share with friends, such as our roasted asparagus served with crispy prosciutto, grain mustard aioli, and shaved preserved egg yolk or the stuffed piquillo peppers with manchego cheese and jerez vinegar. For your main course, we suggest the slow roasted rack of lamb served with traditional chickpea falafel, roasted cauliflower, harissa and mint raita or the seared sea scallops with English pea gnocchi, sunchoke puree and wild mushrooms.

We look forward to seeing you at the Club.

## FACULTY LECTURE SERIES WITH ROBERT GREEN, MD/PHD

Please join us for what promises to be an enlightening discussion between Professor Robert Green and Club member Jan Saragoni.

Robert C. Green, MD, MPH is a medical geneticist and physician-scientist who directs the G2P Research Program in translational genomics and health outcomes in the Division of Genetics at Brigham and Women's Hospital and Harvard Medical School.

Dr. Green is principal investigator of the NIH-funded REVEAL Study, in which a cross-disciplinary team has conducted 4 separate multi-center randomized clinical trials since 2000, collectively enrolling 1100 individuals in order to explore emerging themes in translational genomics. He is principal investigator of the MedSeq Project, the first NIH-funded randomized trial to explore the use of whole genome sequencing in the clinical practice of medicine and co-directs the BabySeq Project,

the first NIH-funded trial of sequencing in newborns. The MedSeq and BabySeq Projects apply genome sequencing both in patients who are affected with hereditary disease and in those who are healthy, in order to study downstream impact on health, behavior and health care costs.

Dr. Green is currently Associate Director for Research of the Partners Center for Personalized Genetic Medicine, a Board Member of the Council for Responsible Genetics and a member of the Informed Cohort Oversight Boards for both the Children's Hospital Boston Gene Partnership Program and the Coriell Personalized Medicine Collaborative. He was the lead author of the recently published recommendations from the American College of Medical Genetics and Genomics for management of incidental findings in clinical sequencing.

Jan Saragoni has been a regular on-air contributor to the Emily Rooney Show on WGBH-FM. A Harvard Kennedy School alumna, she is president of the media relations, marketing and public relations firm Saragoni & Company.


