PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Dear Members,



For the past sixty-five years, the Harvard Club of Boston has been a community's Tale of Two Clubhouses. In complement to our Back Bay Clubhouse, our downtown presence began on November 19, 1954 when a "Harvard Banquet Room" opened upstairs at Purcell's Restaurant on School Street. The facility's intent was to offer members a location where up to 300 at a time could meet for lunch close to work. In March 1967, this dining facility moved to the Old Exchange Building at 22 Battery March Street. The newly branded "Downtown Harvard Club" was to remain there until the present quarters at One Federal Street (a.k.a. The Shawmut Bank Building) opened in 1976.

Most certainly, members' wants and preferences catalyzed the evolving character of our Downtown Clubhouse, i.e. from a mere attic banquet room to a plush and spacious Club and function house. While we are saddened if not disappointed that the HCB will not renew our DTC lease at the close of 2020, it affords us an opportunity to establish yet another city presence, this time reflecting what is relevant and necessary for our membership community in the 21st century. Primary provisions include safety, parking, accessibility, co-working space, kitchen/bar, efficient footprint, etc. Our November 4 meeting to discuss our downtown strategy will be one of a number of forums where our members can share their preferences for our new location.

On Saturday November 2, we will celebrate our Member Appreciation Gala. This year's party sold out faster than any previous year, and we plan to welcome over 500 members and guests. For the first time, we will host a silent auction to benefit our Higginson Foundation. Look for some very cool items to bid on. I think our founder Henry Lee Higginson (1834 – 1919) would be proud of the work we continue to do to ensure vitality in the Clubhouse he built in 1913. The Club was relevant then, and will remain so a hundred years hence.

Dr. Max Gomez is an author and an award-winning broadcast journalist. He is an expert moderator, speaker, emcee and is renowned for his clear, concise presentations of complex medical information to a wide range of audiences. In his book *Cells Are the New Cure*, Dr. Gomez will take you on a tour of the most exciting and leading-edge developments in medicine. You'll meet the doctors performing the lifesaving research and the patients who have survived illnesses that were once considered a death sentence.

The key to these breakthroughs is the use of living cells as medicine instead of traditional drugs. Research has found that our bodies are virtual treasure troves of adult cells that act as agents of remarkable healing and repair. These cells are called adult stem cells because they resemble embryonic cells in their ability able to transform into many other cell types, but without the ethical and moral concerns of embryonic cells.

Promising treatments in more than 35,000 clinical trials

could have dramatic impacts on cancer, autoimmune diseases, organ replacement, heart disease, and even aging itself. These treatments, which are saving the lives of patients in the trials, will soon be rolled to the medical community at large.

Dr. Gomez graduated cum laude from Princeton University, with a Ph.D. from the Wake Forest University School of Medicine. He was also a N.I.H. Postdoctoral Fellow at New York's Rockefeller University. He has served on the National Board of Directors for the American Heart Association, the *Princeton Alumni Weekly* and the Partnership for After School Education. Dr. Gomez has produced award-winning health and science segments and has reported for *Dateline*, *The Today Show* and *48 Hours*. Over nearly three decades, he's earned nine Emmy Awards, three New York State Broadcasters Association awards and UPI's Best Documentary award.





Big Bird Goes to China and Beyond: Negotiating Diffusion on the Longest Street in the World

November marks the 50th Anniversary of Sesame Street, the transformative literacy initiative with authentically local programming across the globe. Remarkably, foreign viewers tend to view their Sesame Street

programming as locally conceived and many or most have no idea of its American origins. Funded by Harvard University and the University of Notre Dame, the research of Professor Tamara Kay represents one of the only diffusion studies to use observational data to track how actors make decisions about cultural adaptation in real time. Her project has involved eight years of intensive ethnographic fieldwork and 200 in-depth interviews in seventeen countries within Latin America, the Middle

East, Africa and Asia. Her research illuminates the nature of negotiations, how actors define and think about cultural authenticity and change, how they weigh and attribute value, and ultimately how hybridization processes unfold.



Professor Kay was Harvard's Co-Director of Transnational Studies Initiative and as an Associate Professor in its Sociology Department. Now Professor of Global Affairs in Notre Dame's Keough School of Global Affairs and Department of Sociology, she is the author or the forthcoming *Sesame Street Travels the World: Organizations and the Politics of Cultural Innovation*, a book on how Project ECHO (Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes) builds international relationships to replicate an innovative healthcare model.


Ghost Work: How to Stop Silicon Valley from Building a New Global Underclass by Mary L. Gray and Siddharth Suri is our November selection.
